The deployed directory can not be your root website.

Now when I go to my website: `deployed.tangerinefiles.com` it shows the slave site!!!! Please how do I fix this asap?

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The fact that you are running under J1.5 is not the problem.

If you have added a slave site that includes the master website in his list, effectively the master is become a slave sites.

2 possibilities:

1) Either you create a fake subdomain that point to you master "document root" directory. In this case the new subdomain will be used as the master because it is not defined as a slave site.

2) You disable temporarily JMS to fix the slave site definition and you restore it just after.

To do that, you can add a file or a folder with the name `/includes/multisites_disable.php`

When it is present, this disable Jms Multi Sites.

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
