The material that is provided concerning the hosting configuration comes from customers that have provide the material for a documentation.

Try to review the tutorial step 0 for the concept and the FAQ on hosting server.

Perhaps you will find something similar for the DirectAdmin.  
When I have a look to the DirectAdmin demo websites, if the Symbolic Link is forbidden, you can try define a CNAME record in the DNS configuration that will result by creating an alias on the domain.  
Perhaps you will have also to use the "Domain Pointer" to create alias on an existing websites.

When creating a sub-domain in DirectAdmin, this create a sub-directory on your website.  
You have to check if the Symbolic Links is allowed.  
If YES, you can deploy the slave site into this directory.

I have figure this out.

What you have to do for the installation.

Install Joomla.

Install the file of multisite

go to directadmin and add domain pointer.

Leave the Create as an Alias on. ([www.slavesite.nl](http://www.slavesite.nl))

Then go to the multisites >manage sites and add the slave site.

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If you try using direct admin with different domain, they create different "direct admin" account.

When you have different hosting account, you don't have the permission to access the directory of another account.

So to use JMS with Direct Admin, you have to change the server permission to allow sharing the folders between several hosting account.

In addition, you may also encounter problem with the files and folder permission.

This may be partially solved when suPHP is installed on the server.

Configuration of permission with DirectAdmin is not easy and is not related to JMS.  
This is hosting configuration to give the permission between different account.

If you are using JMS with slave site defined in a subdirectory, this should avoid the permission problem.

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thank you for the reply. I have it working now following "sitehosters" reply. I now use one and the same hosting account, thus using one subdirectory multisites, which seem to work just fine. DNS settings redirect seperate domains to one single master domain, all is fine in that respect.

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
