I am using a host that uses cpanel. I have already created a folder that contains all of the data for the current website. How do I make the current site into a slave site of the master (this is the site that I have installed the software on). I guess I am not sure what scenario in the tutorials that I should be following.

If you want to move an existing website as a slave site under JMS, this is a manual task that is already explained in this forum.

In very brief, you have to install in the MASTER all the extensions required by the slave site.

Once you have all the extension present in the master you can define a "fresh" slave site under JMS and NOT create its DB. The idea is to re-use the existing website DB or a copy of it with the "configuration.php" files that you copy (or move) into the slave site "deploy directory".

You will also have to copy all the images and material that you have in your current website.

The idea is to install the PHP code under the master and copy all the images, media, video, ... into the new directory structure.

When you have the PHP code present, you can use your existing website DB that is pre-installed for all the extension.

You perhaps will have to change some configuration parameters in the different extension like path to the image folder,

As you can see, this is a manual task.

YES you can use domain for the second slave site.

You just have to configure your HTTP Server with (cPanel or other admin tool) that you have a domain that is located in a specific directory.

You can later provide to JMS the deploy directory where this domain is defined.

See the tutorial video CP-04 that is similar in the case of a domain (use AddOn domain instead of subdomain)

I just got this message - * - You can now map your new domain (<http://www.isurfwky.net/hostedhop/isurfhopkinsville>) to the directory

- * '/home/isurfwky/public_html/hostedhopkinsco/iSurfHopkinsCo/multisites/isurfhopkinsville'.

- * - When the DNS will be updated with your new domain (perhaps you have to wait 24 hours),

- * you will can go to your new domain and Joomla will request you a new installation (as usual).

- * - Please use a new db prefix for each site and NEVER use 'jos' as prefix or if you want to keep 'jos' as prefix, create as many databases than you have sites.

I created a slave site...already had the master site set up as:

I had the original site under <http://www.isurfwky.net/hostedhop/isurfhopkinsville>

a new domain was created called:

/home/isurfwky/public_html/hostedhopkinsco/iSurfHopkinsCo/multisites/isurfhopkinsville

Will the new domain and the installation now be empty?

FORWARD or REDIRECT can not be used because this modify the URL.

As you are using HostGator, I suppose that you have cPanel.

You have to use a "AddOn" domain in cPanel and specify the "document root" associated to the domain.

A domain is NOT a JMS site id.

Read the forum and you will see that move an existing website is a manual task. In summary, you have to install all the extensions required by your slave site into the master. After create a fake "slave" sites where you will copy the current configuration.php file where you will modify manuall some parameters. You will also have to copy all the images, media and other that are specific to your slave site.

As you can understand, move an existings website is moreless redo it with just the possibility to re-use the DB.

In your case, it seems that you have defined a slave site into a subdirectory and not have used a domain or a subdomain.

If this is the case and that you have configure the slave site like in tutorial video 9 the you don't have to setup the cPanel.

Give real description of your configuration.

Do you configure a domain (which name), or a subdomain

Which are the values that you have entered in the "AddOn domain" or the "Subdomain" configuration. review they "document root" path that must be IDENTICAL to the value in the JMS deploy directory.

Both must have the same path.

This is clearly shown in the tutorial video CP-04

If you want to create a slave site into a subdirectory, you just have to copy/paste the value that are shown in the tutorial video 9

- * Site ID = slave1
- * Domain name = {site_url}/multisites/{site_id}
- * Deploy directory = {site_dir}

You DON'T have to copy files or other stuff outside the system.
You don't have to create directory. JMS do it for you.
