CDN stands for a Content Delivery Network. It allows you to synchronise selected files and folders with CDN providers around the world. This is supposed to speed up your website because these files are then served by the server closest to you.

An example of a CDN provider is Amazon S3 with Amazon CloudFront.

You can install a CDN plugin from Nonumber for free and there is also a tutorial about how to set this up on the plugin page.

I didn't really think it would work with JMS because of the symbolic links however I was just wondering if there was a way around this.
