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To replicate a website with all its content (including extensions), you have to define a rule in the "JMS template" and later use this rule in the "JMS manage site".

You have to apply the procedure as described in the tutorial step 13.

It shows how to create a template and how to use it from the front-end.

This also work to create website from the back-end.

Once you have defined the rule, you can use it into the manage site - field template site.

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You have a sample in the tutorial step 9 that show how to create a slave site into a sub-directory.

If you have the symbolic link allowed (see tutorial step 4 to 7), you can just put the 3 parameters as given in tutorial step 9.

Here it is again the 3 parameters:

Sample values:

- \* Site ID = slave1
- \* Domain name = {site\_url}/multisites/{site\_id}
- \* Deploy directory = {site\_dir}

This will create a slave site into www.master.com/multisites/slave1

When you will be able to do that you could try change the parameters to do other configuration

Other sample:

- \* Site ID = slave1
- \* Domain name = {site\_url}/{site\_id}
- \* Deploy directory = {root}/{site\_id}
- \* Create directory = YES

If you want to replicate a website you must use a more sophisticated processing that consist in using the JMS template like shown in the video of tutorial step 13.

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If you can not contact me by email, this is probably because your SMTP server has not a certified IP address or does not match the domain name.

My hosting provide is now very strict concerning the senders and only accept valid sender.

If your SMTP server is not correctly configured, this may explain the reason.

Sorry but for this part, I can not do anything. My hosting provider has taken counter measure against spamming.

If you use a gmail, yahoo mail, .... you should not have any problem.

If the Symbolic Link is not allowed, you have to proceed like for Windows platform.

In this case, you have to use domain name or sub-domain name that you will assign to the same

directory than the master website.

Have a look in the FAQ that give some sample of configuration of your hosting server to acheive this objective to configure the hosting provider with the same directory path.

In the user manual, the samples are also given for this particular case that consist in defining several domain or sub-domain with the same directory path.

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
