This is how I got the configuration of the sites at the moment;

People go to this website: <http://main.com> (example) they are not redirected to <http://en.main.com> domain or another domain for another language.

i have got multisites on the english domain <http://en.main.com> (this is a fresh install of Joomla) I want to then create another english domain on another domain new for example <http://en.main2.com>. This second I want to be able to share the users only not content but every time i try to do this it create a whole new site. I only wanted to be able to share users and have different content on them.

I was wondering if someone could tell me how to archive this or is it best install the main.com domain with Joomla and multisites then create english etc domain of it??

but I still need to know how to do this everytime it create with content in when I dont want that??

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The sharing is an operation that is applied when you create a website based on an existing one.

This means for example that if you want to share the users between the <http://en.main.com> and <http://en.main2.com> you have to begin by the creation of the <http://en.main2.com> that will be a replication of <http://en.main.com> in which you have specified that you share the users.

Once you have this <http://en.main2.com> that replicated everything and also share the users, you can cleanup or modify <http://en.main2.com> to put its own content.

You can also decide to create an hidden website that will be used to share the users between the <http://en.main.com> and <http://en.main2.com> to avoid replicate all the content of the <http://en.main.com>.

You can find a video in tutorial step 16 that present how to share the users between websites.

If i am not able to create a slave site using then able to login I dont know where i can go from here.

also the symbolic link is not in the action list in the template is it that what might be causing it?? as i am on windows server

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When you share the user, this mean that you have to use the users form the original website. In this case this is probably the super administrator of the <http://en.main.com>.

If you are able to login in <http://en.main.com>., you can login with the same user in the <http://en.main2.com>.

When sharing a website, you can NOT say that the DB is populated with the user as they are SHARED and NOT replicated (populated).

Use the JMS tools to check the user sharing and check the DB tables creations.  
If you don't have a link between the website, this mean that you have not create a slave site that share the user.

Review the tutorial step 16 and apply it strictly.  
I suggest that you follow the example stricly to try understand the processing.  
Once you will be familiar with the concept, you will be able to apply it to your particular case.

As explained in the tutorial step 4 to 7, you will see that when working on Windows platform, the Symbolic Link is not available under Windows platform.  
The Symbolic Links is only available to Unix platform.  
Also read the user manual that describe the Symbolic Links.

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
