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NO there is no limit.

When you order JMS, you can create unlimited number of master website and you can also create unlimited number of slave site from the back-end.

The only case where you could have to buy website quota is in the case where you activate the "billable website" for the website creation from the front-end.

This is used for the customisation or when you want to sale the website creation to your customers. Otherwise, standard website creation from the front-end is also unlimited.

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YES this is a GNU/GPL license version 2 as documented and also repeated at the end of our user manual.

If you need to install JMS on several master, you are totally free and this is also unlimited.

You can have individual DB and also unique DB.

This is your choice and you may perhaps take in consideration the backup procedure.

Create individual DB with different MySQL user and password may be more secured than use a same

DB for all the customers.

At our knowledge, the maximum Upload site is a PHP.ini file parameter that is setup by your hosting provider.

Perhaps you can also add parameters in the ".htaccess" file to change the default PHP.ini file.  
See the parameter "upload\_max\_filesize" in php.ini
