So my guess will register at the master site and be logged in automatically to all subdomain sites after login in to master site. i do want each site to have it own database so i can make each one unique as far as site template goes.

Mow how do I do that what do i first and which fields do i fill in the component. all i have done so far is install fresh copy of joomla and install component the subdomain sites have nothing yet but the subdomain folder created and empty inn the root.

In your case you have to create a JMS templates  
Template ID = share\_master  
Put a domain name like: sub-domain.masterdomain.com  
You could write a rule like {site\_id}.masterdomain.com

Select the site: master DB  
Deploy directory: could be something that is based on the sub-domain  
This could be something like /home/...../public\_html/{site\_dir}  
All depênds the rule that you will have decided when you create a sub-domain in your hosting administration tool like cPanel.  
The deploy directory rule must be consistent with the rule that you will have decided to apply when creating a sub-domain on your hosting server.

As you also want to have specific template folder, you can also define a simiar rule to the deploy folder  
/home/...../public\_html/{site\_dir}/templates

Have a look also in the File and Folder tabs (JMS 1.2.7 or higher) give you the possibility to decide how to create this directory (from special rule, copy or unzip).

Once you have defined the rule you can create the sub-domain on your hosting server (cPanel, godaddy, ...)  
Ensure that directory is empty.

Once you have the sub-domain and its specific directory created, go in JMS manage site and create the slave site using your template.  
Soecify a new DB, user and login.

Perhaps you have to create the DB before you use it.

All depends if the MySQL user has the permission to create the DB dynamically.

I was under the whole impression that you had to create a slave site and that was the only way to share users was through another slave site.

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We never recommend to share the master website for security reason.

We prefer to recommend to have the master website as a confidential domain.

You should better consider the master website as an empty website that is used as repository of all the possible extension available for the slave sites.

The security is based on the security of all the extensions installed.

Joomla is secured but some extensions maybe less secured.

Therefore we think better to keep the master website that by definition has all the extensions available as confidential.

The slave site can only install part of the extensions available from this master website repository.

This explain why we present the sharing from an empty website and not from the master website.

This empty website maybe the "main" public website (not the master website).

In addition, JMS should not be installed in the slave site because the management of the slave site from a slave site is not necessary a functionality that should be used.

We have disabled some functionalities in this case to avoid doing wrong things.

If you want to share the master website, this also mean that you will replicate the JMS extension that is not recommended.

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when you say master website as a confidential website how would i accomplish that. would they all not have to be in the same hosting account on the same server for jms to function as it goes by root path when creating slave site.

the only way I see this being possible is to create a subdomain and use a htaccess file to password protect that folder and prevent robots from crawling it is that what your saying.

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In general to create a confidential master website, it can be a sub-domain of an existing website.

So when you have a domain like www.domain.com you just have to create a master.domain.com or when you are hosting several domain you can also buy other domain and later add the existing domain to your hosting (like you will do with a slave site).

You can effectively use sub-domaini and and a robot.txt to avoid crawling ad also add an .htaccess with password to control the access.

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In this error message, you see that you are using JFTP that means that you have enabled the Joomla FTP Layer.

It seems that you have not correctly setup the FTP Layer as it is not allowed to create directory with your FTP user and password provided to joomla.

Check the FTP parameters in the Global Configuration.

Review also the tutorial video 15 that show how to setup the FTP Layer.

You can test your FTP parameter with an external FTP tool and re-use exactly the same parameter than the one that you have provided to Joomla.

When you have the FTP logged, check that the path you have provided to Joomla is correct and if you can create directory like "tmp"

It simple if I have a master site in a subfolder of my account can I create my master slave site in the root of my hosting account. This means that the slave will be higher than the master.

Ex. Domain.commaster =====> master joomla install

Domain.com =====> master slave site

Absolute path layout

Homeuserpublic\_htmlmaster =====> master joomla install

Homeuserpublic\_html =====> master slave site

This setup does not work for me let me show you what works and what all your tutorial show

Domain.commaster =====> master joomla install

Domain.commasterslave =====> slave site

That works ever time as the slave site is lower than the master.

So your paths would look like this'

Homeuserpublic\_htmlmaster =====> master joomla install

Homeiserpublic\_htmlmasterslave =====> slave site

All your tutorials are the master is the highest and the slave are all subfolders and subfolders and more subfolders none of them follow my example so i guess it not possible maybe you never thought about using it that way.

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I have perfectly understood the question and I repeat that you can create a slave site in the parent directory.

This is not the origin of your JFTP error or whatever else.

To demonstrate that you can do it, I have created a special video that show that you have NO error during the creation of the slave site.

The only thing that you will have as result is the conversion of the master subdirectory into the "parent" slave site as you have defined this domain as being a slave site.

This is totally normal and is not the reason of the errors you have when you create the slave site.

If you want that we assist you in this special setup and try identifying the reason of your error, I repeat that we can do that with billable support.

With the video we have just demonstrated that there is no error and that you can do that event if the result is perhaps not the one that you might expect
