Edwin, one problem with that video is that it only shows you how to set up sites on the same domain. There isn't a video or tutorial showing how to do this with two different domains. This would be very helpful. I believe most are probably setting up separate domains than anything else.

You just have to provide another "domain" in the list of domain. I just remember also that Single Sign-In is not available when using different domains. Only the users are shared and they will have to re-login with the same login and password.

The key element is the configuration of your HTTP server and know which directory is associated to the domain. So all depends the HTTP administration tool (cPanel, Godaddy, ...). Once you are able to define or describe the relationship between a domain name and its location on the disk, you can define the JMS template rule according this relationship.

I'm not looking for a single login. I just don't want users to have to re-register and have one account for both sites.

The two domains are DASOUTH.COM (to be master) and DASOUTHTV.COM (to be slave).

The master site directory is /home/dasouth/public_html

So what should the settings be? I want to use two separate databases as well.
