

Where to install master? How to install?

How do you create the master. Say I have www.prettydomain.com.

I install the master at <http://master.prettydomain.com> right?

So I download latest version of Joomla, install it into <http://master.prettydomain.com>, run install to set up joomla with all bells and whistles, like JoomGallery, Community Builder, some fine theme etc. Last but not least I install JMS Multisites.

The I go install Slave1, that is actually my main site, namely: <http://www.prettydomain.com>

Slave 2 is yet another domain, www.prettierdomain.com, but resides physically at the prettydomain/multisites/prettydomain.

Am I correct? I have some questions.

<http://master.prettydomain.com> is reachable for anyone! How do you prevent this???

I can even surf to your master joomla: <http://master.demo.jms2win.com/> !

How do you install a new version of Joomla! Since you have your own install base.

I simply do not grasp the concept. How to create master, what to install on master, how to prevent master from being seen by my website visitors, etcetera.

This thing is a nightmare to grasp. Any help would be appreciated.

YES create a specific master website is a good practice that we recommend.

You can protect your master.prettydomain.com with an additional password in .htaccess password or even block all IPs addresses except the one of your Internet Service Provider (ISP) from which you are doing the maintenance of your websites.

The standard procedure to install the joomla update.

With joomla, you have to unzip or untar their distribution.

In general I recommend to start uninstall the JMS patches before applying the joomla update.

The master website is the repository or library of all the extensions required by all your slave sites. So you have to install everything.

You have plenty of video in the tutorial that give an overview and explain how to install, JMS and

configure some cases.

The tutorials are almost impossible to follow. Verry bad audio quality and poor english, sorry to say, I don't mean to be rude or anything. The diagrams are very helpfull but the master website just drops out of the sky. The master is taken as a fact and in the videos there is no explanation on how to set-up or maintain the master.

If I understand you correctly the master website is the website on which I should install a new version of Joomla. I thought the JMS package came with an install directory that goes with a specific joomla version. These are things that do not become clear watching the video's.....

So from time to time there is a new JMS package, I can just overwrite the current JMS? And when a new version of Joomla comes along I should uninstall the JMS patches, install Joomla on master only, reapply the patches and all should be fine?

You need to fix this with DNS. I use an IP address for the master and the real www.whatever.com as the main site set with virtual domains in httpd.conf. Works well. But yes, it's a steep learning curve but worth persisting if you need to share certain databases. Otherwise you would not need it.

It seems I am not the only one who can't get his head around the whole "template" issue.

It is the part like this that give me head-ache: " It is possible to use sub-directory which is computed based on some parameters provided by the user. In particular, it is possible to define a domain name alias." What?

I mean using examples like master1.demo.jms2win.com/slave1 is not going to help to understand what's going on. This is paid component and manual is part of the deal. If you feel the price does not cover your expenses then increase the JMS price upfront but provide decent tutorial, not half-baked one.

You have a user manual and tutorial that described JMS Multisites.

This is not in the scope of JMS Multisites to provide user manual for all the HTTP Server administration tool that should be provided by your hosting company.

We can not know all the possible hosting company administration tools and user interface to setup correctly your domain and subdomain.

So as soon as you want to setup a domain or a subdomain you have to refer to the documentation provided by your hosting provider and their admin tool.

The only case that we can document is the one that use subdirectories as this assume that you already have a domain or subdomain correctly configured.

We just have illustrated one case concerning cPanel that is a very popular administration tool.

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
