Did you defined the domain with the "www" and without the "www" ?

Perhaps you also have to check if you HTTP Server accept to follow "Symbolic LInks".

This is generally an option present in the .htaccess that is generally also set on the server

Options +FollowSymLinks

You can try to test the Symbolic Links with the tutorial video 7 to check if this is accepted by your server.

You also have to check if you have deployed the slave site into the correct directory path as you seems mentioned that when you test it with the "multisites/slave.com" directory it is working.

This probably mean that you have deployed the slave site into the {site_dir} but have specified a domain name that is not {site url}/multiisites/{site id}.

The domain name and deploy directory must be consistend and the HTTP + the location on the disk
