I am new at this but I did have another multisite working good using Joomla 1.5 but now with the a fresh install using Joomla 1.6 I am experiencing some problems. I installed multisites Version 1.2.45 (Latest available: 1.2.45) and Patches definition Version 1.2.51 (Latest available: 1.2.51) on Joomla! 1.6.0 Stable 10-Jan-2011 23:00 GMT. Everything is working with Multisite on the Master. Unix Symbolic Links: Allowed MySQL Version: 5.0.91-log Sharing supported

But after adding my first domain with Multisite Manager I get this error after inputting the database information during Joomla setup of new domain.

Parse error: syntax error, unexpected '{', expecting T_STRING in /homepages/1/domains/htdocs/master/administrator/components/com multisites/libraries/joomla/jms2wi nfactory.php(134): eval()'d code on line 2 jms2winfactory.php: Class not found in configuration file cont...

So I try to go http://mysitedotcom/administrator/index.php and also receive this error: Parse error: syntax error, unexpected '{', expecting T STRING in /homepages/1/domains/htdocs/master/configuration.php on line 2

I am trying to install my New DOMAIN in another separate directory /homepages/1/domains/htdocs/mynewsitedotcom/ from the master directory /homepages/1/domains/htdocs/master/

Is that proposed layout correct? Can I use a separate directory for the mynewsitedotcom or does it have to be a subdirectory of the master? Is there something wrong with the configuration file why it is not finding it? I want to use the original master Joomla files to control mynewsitedotcom.

All of the symbolic links seem to be in place in /homepages/1/domains/htdocs/mynewsitedotcom/ but the site fails to function.

PS I changed the URL above to preserve privacy. If you need anymore infomation I will be happy to provide it. Thanks.

The JMS Multisites version 1.2.45 was compatible with Joomla 1.6.0 RC1 but not the stable one. We fixed that in the JMS Multisites 1.2.46 that is now partially compatible with Joomla 1.6.0 stable. So you can get the latest version when following the procedure described in the FAQ http://www.ims2win.com/en/fag/fag-joomla-multi-sites#cat-122 This will send you a new download ID

Joomla 1.6.0 will not allow me to install com multisites V1.2.46 over the current one. I uninstalled the patches first.. But still Joomla sends error.

So I thought I would try uninstalling patches then removing Multisites completely and starting over, Well that made it worse now I can only access the front end and not the back-end of my Master Joomla.

Back to square one. I will start all over. What happens when another version of Multisite is updated? Will I have this much trouble upgrading? What about Joomla updates? I respectfully request more documentation on the update process.

The new Joomla 1.6 does not allow anymore to install JMS Multisites over existing one. You effectively have to un-install JMS Multisites before installing the update.

As Joomla 1.6 stable is very new, we still have to produce a documentation for that. Between the RC1 and the stable one, there is still incompatible things introduced in Joomla 1.6.0 between the RC1 and more with Joomla 1.5.x.

This is the reason why we still mentioned that current JMS Multisites 1.2.46 is still partially compatible as we still have to work on the new 1.6 stable new installation processing.
