Wow, I figure it out. Setup a test enviroment and play through various configurations to exclude error sources and localize the trigger. The solution takes me a whole day and is basically very simple if you

know how multisite functioned.

The slave site I setup works with symbolic links. Considering a small installation I switch all items to "ignore" which are obviously not necessary in the template settings. One of them was "multisite". And actually it isn't really necessary til the point you use "Article Sharing".

So after I create a new "symbolic link" to multisite everything works like it should.

I think this is a really important point and should be consider in the documentation as well as in the preferences of "folder and files".

Hope it helps one or two.

Multisite is a useful utilitie but the documentation leaves much to be desired.
