Now the main site works fine (aamembers.org.nz) but the two subdomains (aa.org.nz and aaconvention.org.nz) have a session database error.

I just resaved the slave site definitions within the master site multisites administration area and this resolved the issue - panic over :-)

However, I am reconsidering upgrading from 1.5.15 due to this. Any thoughts on if this is a good idea or anything to watch out for as I did spot a few references to problems with 1.5.16 onwards.

If the table was missing, the fact that you performed an open/save in Jms Multi Sites has rebuild the missing tables using the rule present for the slave.

Perhaps you had shared the users and that all views where not restored.
