This is NOT the best directory structure.

See the tutorial video 0.b slide 20 to 24 that give the directory structure.

In your case you should have

www.mydomain.com => /home/user/domains/mydomain.com/public html

=> /home/user/domains/mydomain.com/subdomains/master/public html master.mydomain.com => /home/user/domains/mydomain.com/subdomains/slave/public\_html slave.mydomain.com

So that the domains and subdomain always have their own directory that is not a subdirectory of
