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Hi Edwin. Im having an issue with this extension also. When I try to use SEF URLs on a "Article-Sharing" link I always get:

?site\_id=%3Amaster\_db%3A

after the SEF url.

I have tried to include that in the base url inside AceSEF and no matter what the menu click ads the this ID to my url.

all my menu items/internal links that are site specific work perfectly with JMS and AceSEF, its just the Articles that are shared across multiple domains that are changing my SEF links.

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The site ID is a parameter added with the "Article Sharing for JMS". It is normal as we have not rewritten the Joomla article SEF.

Perhaps we will re-implement the Joomla article SEF to hide the site ID when possible but this is not available for the moment.

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If the site ID is not present in the menu item ID corresponding to the URL for which you want to hide the site id then you could create a hidden menu that correspond to multisites "single" articles (not blog or whatever).

The fact that you will use a single articles will ensure that the site\_id will be saved in the menu item description.

When you are sure that the site id is present in the corresponding menu item id that is present in the URL, that means that you could simply remove the site\_id parameter present in the URL.

If you had to create a hidden menu, use the "alias" associated to this menu as SEF name that you will use in the sh404SEF.

Normally the standard joomla SEF, start to get the menu item id description with all its parameters and if the site id is present, it can be removed from the URL.

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If you had read the "change history" that we mentioned, you would have see that you didn't have to  
uninstall the extension but just perform as "purge converted files" in the back-end of the "multi sites  
content" menu.

Because you have uninstall the extensions, I suspect that all the menu item ID contain now the  
reference to an older component id. Joomla (not JMS Multisites) use teh component identifier that is  
attributed when you have installed the extension. As you have uninstall them, then you have to re-open  
and re-save the menu items to ensure that the new component id is assigned for the menu items.
