The problem is clear.

The define "PATH_COMPONENT_ORIGINAL" is not declared that let suppose that the code is called outside the the "Article Sharing for JMS".

Perhaps you have a plugin or something outside that perform a direct call to the router.php

The only way to identify it is to debug on your server and display the stack when this error is generated. This will tell you which extension (module, plugin,) perform a direct call to that without using the "com_multisitescontent" entry point.

If you don't want to debug yourself and try identify the reason why this

"PATH_COMPONENT_ORIGINAL" the solution is that you order our billable support to do the diagnosis on your server.

I'm running into the same issue. The only module that is coming up with "JFile::read: Unable to open file: 'JPATH_COMPONENT_ORIGINAL/helpers/route.php'" is the (mod_multisiteslatestnews) and the (mod multisitesnewsflash). I disabled other modules and plug-ins to see if there was any conflict and nothing seams to point to why I'm still getting that JFile error. Even with the debug system enabled I still didn't see anything that was pulling the route.php file.

The 500 and 404 error are probably due to wrong URL settings.

You must understand that the URL is computed based on the target websites. So if the target website as the SEF enabled, the URL is computed based on this settings.

So for each case, you have to check the URL produced and verify that the target website understand this URL.

So when you redirect to the full URL, this is the SEF of the target website that is analyzed to compute the URL.

When using the article sharing, this is the reverse. This is the SEF of the current websites.

I didn't realize that I needed to build a Multisites Article Menu Item in the Slave Site to link to the Master Site News Categories as well as the Master Site. That was causing the linking issue on the Slave Site. I didn't have a Menu Item that referred to the Master site's News articles, that was why it was giving me 404 and 500 errors.

Plus, the recent change to the Content Modules fixed the JFile error. Thanks:)

First the fix that we delivered does not concern the modules but the "Article Sharing for JMS" component.

Second, you can not remove the normalization.

You probably have to check the SEF extension.

Sometimes SEF extension does not process correctly the URL and add other info.

We already see that with the standard joomla SEF plugin that does not process correctly all the possible SEF cases and in particular the "form" tags.
