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The extension is more than 1.8MB.  
Perhaps your server has a timeout during the upload of the package.

An alternate solution is to unzip the extension in a temporary directory on your server and retry installing it from this directory.

So in joomla installation, choose in this case install from the directory where you have unzipped it.

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You have to unzip the ZIP into a directory of your server and provide to Joomla installation directory the full path where you have unzipped the distribution.

ie: suppose that you want to install com\_multisites\_v1.2.22.zip  
Suppose that your website is located on your disk in  
/var/www/myaccount/master/public\_html

There, you probably have a "tmp" directory.  
You can see the path in the "Global Configuration"  
Assume that the "tmp" directory is located  
/var/www/myaccount/master/public\_html/tmp

There create a directory like 'jms'  
/var/www/myaccount/master/public\_html/tmp/jms

Unzio all the content in this directory  
/var/www/myaccount/master/public\_html/tmp/jms

Now you can intall from this directory  
/var/www/myaccount/master/public\_html/tmp/jms

I tried different configurations until i got the write one, needless to say it was different than expected!

/home/xxx/xxx/

The JMS update then installed absolutly fine....

However I got back into the office today and the 'Path to Folder' address has reset itself to  
localhost/xxx/xxx/

This means that symbolic links were again forbidden - so i changed the address back again and seems  
ok.

Why would this address change, both;  
- Server Settings > Path to Temp-folder  
- System Settings > Path to Log folder

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Each time you save a slave site, this rebuild the configuration.php files that is used by the slave site. The configuration.php file is build based on the website that must be copied.

If you modified the Global Configuration after you have created the slave site and later you resave the slave site definition, this will replace your current configuration.php files like if you have just created a new one.

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
