A potential reason is the timeout of PHP. Try to transfert the zip in a temporary directory in your server and after unzip it. Once it is unzipped into a temporary directory, use the Joomla install from a directory. This will avoid the timeout that may happen during the upload of the package. JMS is now more than 2MB.

You can for example create in your "tmp" directory a directory like "jms".

Transfert the com multisites XXX.zip into the "tmp/jms" directory

Unzip the com_multisitesXXX.zip present in the "tmp/jms"

When done, you can provide the full pat in the joomla installation from a directy

Path like "/home/...../tmp/jms"

Now it should find the package.
