If that is true can it be achieved with 1 master database or would I need to create multiple databases. If I need to create multiple databases can I still update site core files and extensions from a master site?

I read somewhere that I needed symlinks to achieve the unique image folders. I don't know if that's true, but I went ahead and verified that symlinks work with my hosting provider. So, I know that I'm good to go if needed.

1) Yes you can create wehsites with the own "/images" directory. This is illustrated in tutorial video CP-05 http://www.jms2win.com/en/tutorial#jms12x-CP-05

2) Yes you can use a single DB.

In this case, under joomla 1.5, we recommend to never use the "jos_" table prefix for the master website in case where you would use the default (jos_) prefix when creating a slave site.

Under Joomla 2.5, this recommendation is not required as Joomla generate a random table prefix.

3) In general, yes it is recommended to have the symbolic link available to have a specific "/images"
