Trying to install again gives me the message: It was not possible to copy the selected file. JInstaller::install: Failed to copy file: /home/..../admin/admin.multisites.php to /home/..../public html/administrator/components/com multisites/admin.multisites.php

Checking the server: com multisites/admin.multisites.phpis not there.

Can't uninstall either. What to do now??

No not try to un-install if your slave sites are still runing because if you un-install JMS, it should also remove the patches.

In your case and based on your description, it seems that the directory /home/..../public html/administrator/components/com multisites does not exists.

JMS is designed to accept fresh install or update.

Therefore in all cases, you can re-install JMS over an existing one.

I suspect that you have a permission problem when you try to re-install JMS.

When Joomla encounter a problem during the installation of an extension, it perform a rollback. This is perhaps what is happen. Joomla has perhaps remove the content of this com multisites directory due to the "failed to copy file".

If this is a permission problem, you can try re-install JMS using the Joomla FTP Layer.

On windows platform, if you have a permission problem, you can use the procedure described in the FAQ http://www.ims2win.com/fag#sec-27

This procedure is applicable for IIS.

I suspect a problem of permission to re-install JMS.

Concerning your second problem, I need your product ID to check in my database its status.

The registration button is present in the "about" menu when it is not registered.

If it is registered, the button is not displayed.

This is the reason why I need to check my jms2win.com database to verify your identifier.

Send me your identifier by email.

I have saw the your product 4202.....ISQN had effectivelly the identifier missing. I have added and that should solve the problem. I will try identify on my website the reason why it has not be saved correctly. Thank you for having reported this problem.
