To use JMS, in a sub-directory, you need to work on a unix machine and have symbolic available.

If this is the case, you have to specify the deploy directory to allow JMS create the symbolic links that are used to redirect all the queries to the master directory.

You also have to check that your apache or .htaccess file is configure with option followSymLink to follow the links.

On Windows IIS, you have to use Virtual Directory to redirect them to the master directory.
