

## upgr 1.1.19: slave site from template patch error

Hi,

i just upgraded jms to 1.1.19 on my master site, which i use as a template to clone new sites from.

The upgrade went fine, and the master / template master is fine as well (all checks are ok). However when I create a new slave site from the template and log in to the backend on the new slave, I get a patch error on the JMS modules It says not all patches are installed, but when I click install to fix the configuration.php I cannot log in into the backend anymore, the frontend is fine.

Some patches are not installed.

Please check patches and proceed with patch installation to allow multisites working properly.

configuration.php Not OK

•The routing wrapper is not present in this MASTER configuration file.

Actions:

□ Add 16 lines containing the routing wrapper to the slave site.

I do think it is strange that I gives me this error on newly created slaves from the template. making a new template did not help either. am afraid there is something not right in the master anymore or something..

i tried uninstalling the patches, but that seemed to have made things worse for a while. the master site went back into "installation" mode and I had to rename the installation folder to get it working again.

is there any way this can be fixed without starting all over again? I was nearly finished with my sites and now they are giving this configuration.php client wrapper patch error.

copying the configuration.php from the master site that passes all checks did not help either, still a blank administrator GUI.

check all permissions, but they are fine that cannot be it either.

Dear Stefan,

When you have a problem on the master configuration.php file this probably means that the files have been modified or replaced from the outside.

When the patches are correctly installed, the Global Configuration update the appropriate configuration.php file. If the patch is missing, this means that the standard Joomla master configuration file layout is used (the wrapper is not present).

When you have tried to un-install the patches, normally the "installation" directory is renamed (not deleted).

As you seem that you had to remove or rename it to restore the access, this is effectively abnormal and probably the symptom of another problem.

When the installation of patches does not work, JMS tries restoring the original files that were present when you have installed JMS on your server the first time.

This may also explain why the configuration.php files have no wrapper present.

hi,

thanks for the reply but I am unsure about what to do now.

On 1.1.17 everything was working perfectly, all slaves were ok and creating a new slave as well. Then I upgraded the master to 1.1.19, this worked ok. All checks are fine now on 1.1.19 and patches 1.8. Just when I create a new slave now or go to an existing slave I get the configuration.php error, which it cannot patch.

I have no special extensions installed and the two I had (phoca and chronoforms) are working fine. Just when I tried uninstalling on the slave did the installation folder return. Nothing else was changed but upgrading JMS since I was near ready to release the slaves.

Is there any way to restore/reinstall/recreate the configuration.php so that it will work again on the slaves?

could you please give me pointers as how to proceed now? And what does it mean the slave wrapper? the slaves-frontend seem to be working still.

thanks for the quick reply.

I don't see why you have a patch to perform on the slave configuration.php file.

Normally, there is not patch for the slave and only for the master configuration.php file.

In addition, the patch was already required in JMS 1.1.17 and I don't see particular changes on this part between JMS 1.1.17 and 1.1.19.

The slave configuration.php files are stored in the /multisites/xxx directory or in the deployed directory.

Concerning the master "configuration.php" files, there are backup at the installation time in the administratorcomponentscom\_multisitesbackup\_on\_install and backup  
In those directory, you will find the backup of all the files before the patches.

uninstall/reinstall JMS on the master? replace a configuration.php and roll out the patches again? The master thinks itself okay, it is just the slaves that say configuration.php is not patched, can I repatch or put a clean file somewhere to make it work from here on?

the frontends seem to be working still, even as multisites from the same master DB with their prefixes,  
so I don't know what is broken now exactly or how to fix it,

I don't understand how you can have this message except if you try to manage the slave sites from slave sites (and not from the master website).

yes, i started out with one website that i created just the way we like it, then i installed JMS, JMS article sharing and JMS menu button. using this I created shared articles to finish the site. So this finished master has JMS on it and from that I created all the slaves.

Does the slave not need JMS for the article sharing then? And is it a problem i used the JMS site as a master for my slaves?

I did not install JMS on the slave though, just replicated it from the master.

The "Articles Sharing" does not required that JMS be installed on the slave sites.

As all the files and folders are shared between all the website, it is able to connect internally to the JMS websites definition without requiering the JMS installation on each slave site.

JMS is just required on the master website.

In general, I recommend to never install JMS on the slave site to avoid that slave site admnistrator perform modification on the website definition.

Hi again,

I just noticed some regression after doing as described above and creating slaves without JMS but with the article sharing and the menu bridge.

for some reason after removing JMS on the slaves and also when creating new slaves without JMS from the new "template-master" the menu bridge for new sites is not working anymore. When I create a menu bridge on a slave to a button on another site I just get a blank screen.

If I create the menu bridge on the JMS master (with JMS installed) the menu bridge is working fine though.

Am I doing something wrong here or is it impossible to create working menu bridges without JMS installed? Some of my slaves have bridges but not all, so I would not want them created all in the master site.

This is the link created when I click a bridge button in a new slave site:

no after all it does appear to be something else. bridges i created \*before\* removing JMS from the slave sites continue to work (in IE8 and firefox), but newly created bridges on the slaves without JMS do no work anymore, both in FF and IE8.

It also works if I create the bridge in the JMS-master and then clone it to a new slave site and remove JMS.

well since my sites had to go live last week I had to replace the menu bridge with an native "external link" pointing to the menu-item on the central site because for some reason it isn't working for me anymore when i create bridges on the slaves, just when i create a bridge on the jms master before cloning the site it works and keeps working, however i created all my slaves now and they wanted another shared bridge, which just blanks out when used.
