Had 22 sites set up and working fine. Now they do not appear in Site Manager. The list is empty.

However, they are still in configuration.mutisites.php.

What has happened?

The list of files that is displayed in Site Manager is the list of directory present in /multisites and having config multisites.php file present in thoses directories.

If there are no more directories inside /multisites or there is no more config multisites.php in all those sub-directories then nothing will appear in the site manager.

Which "configuration.mutisites.php." are you speaking.

This files does not exisits in JMS.

Perhaps you mean config multiistes.php.

In this case in which directory?

Because JMS creates many config multisites.php (one per slave site and also a general one)

If for example you have deleted manually the directories under /multisites, you also have deleted the slave site configuration and this is normal that you don't see the slave site (because you have deleted them).

#### Another question is:

- are you working from the master website or do you try using JMS from a slave site?
- If you try manage JMS from a slave site, do you have the multisites directory created in the slave site deployment folder?

JMS should normally be managed from the master website and not from a slave site.

We recommend to never install JMS in the slave sites.

UPDATE: Problem solved. It was a permissions problem with my hosting service. They told me they had changed permissions, when in fact they had not.

All sites are back up and running.

My mistake. I meant config\_multiistes.php

In this case in which directory? Because JMS creates many config\_multisites.php (one per slave site and also a general one)

They are all there. 1 per subsite directory, and 1 in /multisites directory

Another question is:

- are you working from the master website or do you try using JMS from a slave site? Master

Also, the tmp and logs directories are there, permissions on all directories and files under /multisites is 766.

Symbolic links was forbidden when I created the sites, but still the subsites worked for a day or so.

So now, I contacted the web host, and symbolic links is now allowed.

I suspect I need to fix this by performing another step, but I am not sure what it is.

I tried the "create master\_link" procedure in the hello.php script, but I must not be entering the full path correctly. No matter what I put in, it says "path does not exist".

What would the full path be if my site is www.mydomain.com, my hosting server shows the path to my site as /hosting/content/xxxx/html, and subsite\_1 is in /hosting/content/xxxx/html/multisites/subsite\_1

Or is there a different problem I need to fix?
