Website Quota are required when you want to sell the creation of website from the front-end or when you want to customize the website creation from the front-end.

Otherwise, website quota is not required when you create slave sites from the back-end.

You can create unlimited number of website from the back-end without website quota.

Now that we are sure that you can execute PHP into the harpercreek directory, we have to check the JMS slave configuration.

With the "hello.php", I see that Symbolic Link is allowed.

Is it the same with JMS. See settings and tutorial step 6.

If the answer is YES, have you deployed the slave site in "{site_dir}" ?

See tutorial step 9.

If YES, you have to check in the harpercreek directory that you have the index.php and plenty of symbolic links. You should have the same directory structure than you master root directory.

This is normal to have the /multisites directory into a slave site as remember that each slave site must have the same directory structure than the master website.

Review the tutorial step 0 and that present the concept and at the end explain the Symbolic Link concept very quickly.

In your screenshot the Symbolic Link are displayed with a L attribute and your FTP tool also show the real path.

If you can not execute files into the /multisites/xxxx directory, this is probably the origin of your problem.

Try to change the permission of this directory (ie chmod 777) to check this hypothesis.

Perhaps you will also have to change the permission of the multisites directory.

Use the hello.php file to test your Hosting Server configuration and permissions.

When you will be able to execute the "hello.php" file in this /multisites/xxx directory then you can retry without the "index.php" to see if it starts the slave site.

The creation of the 'master_link' directory is successful

You have now a link ->

You can try to use the URL like http://www.slave.com/master_link/hello.txt

Do I need to do this for each slave site? When I go to the url:

While you are not able to execute the "hello.php" file into the sub-directory, you have to check your hosting permission and configuration.

This is not related to Joomla or JMS.

The content of the index.php files is correct.

It will only be executed when you will have found the reason of the permission error in the sub-directory. This is an administrative work that is not related to JMS or Joomla as you can not even execute the "hello.php" file.

Perhaps you have specific parameters in your hosting server (perhaps apache) that does not allow execute files in the /multisites directory.

YES, you use the "Website Template" to define the replication rule.

You can effectively decide to replicate the master website event if I don't recommend to do it because JMS is already installed and that you will share the same DB than your master website.

In general, I suggest to have a specific DB for the slave site and NOT install JMS on a slave site.

You can effectively use the "Website Template" in the "manage site" (back-end) or in the front-end as presented in the tutorial step 13 video.

You must proceed as you do when you install a fresh Joomla with a new DB.
Just give another table prefix to avoid using the "jos_" table prefix.

You want the exhaustive list of folder and files and are required to work in your specific environment. All I can give you is the list of folder and files that you can get yourself when unzipping the Joomla distribution.

If you have installed specific software like DocMan or others, they may create specific directories like dmdocuments directory.

Sorry but this is specific to each customer and I am not able to give you an exhaustive list except if I have access to your server and see and analyze each extension that you will have installed on your master website.

If you don't select anything in the "folder and files" panel, you will have everything that will be replicated. Normally, you are the person the best place to know what you have installed on your server and which directories you have created for your own business.

If you want that I analyze what you have installed and what you need for the business you are developing, YES this will be specific support that you can order on
